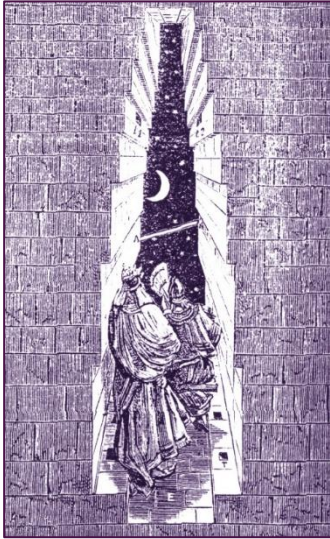

Astrology is not a religion or associated with any religion.

Astrology does not involve any physical “rays” or magical energies emanating from the cosmos.

Astrology columns (a.k.a. “sun sign” astrology) in magazines and newspapers are for entertainment purposes only.

Astrology birth charts are not always reflective of the person at all times during their life. People change.

All charts are maps (tools, guides) of *potential* opportunities and obstacles. Nothing is carved in stone.

Only your choices and decisions determine what happens in your life. We all make mistakes. Act wisely.

Avoid self-fulfilling prophecies that make you a “karmic victim.”



Things You Should Know About Astrology



Geography - where cities, states, and countries are.

Time, timing, and time zones - man-made creations.

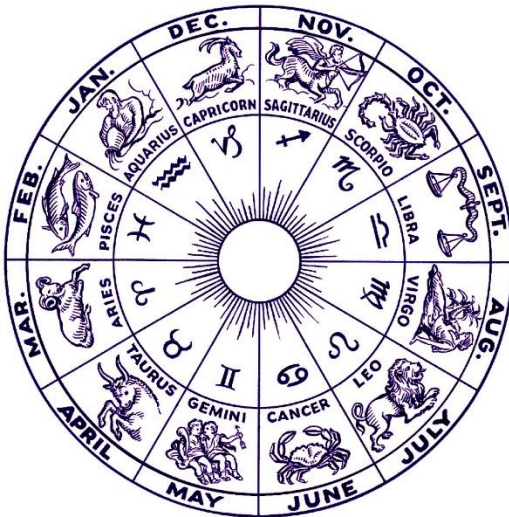
Calendars and dates - man-made creations.

Symbolism - everything in astrology has multiple meanings.

Psychology - how people think and act, patterns of behavior.



Helpful Knowledge



The word zodiac comes from the Latin *zōdiacus* and Greek *zōdiakos*, both meaning “animals,” and the Greek *kyklos* (*key-klos*) meaning “circle.”

So the zodiac is a “circle of animals” even though four signs are not animals: Libra=scales, Sagittarius=archer, Capricorn=sea goat, and Aquarius=water-bearer



Signs of the Zodiac

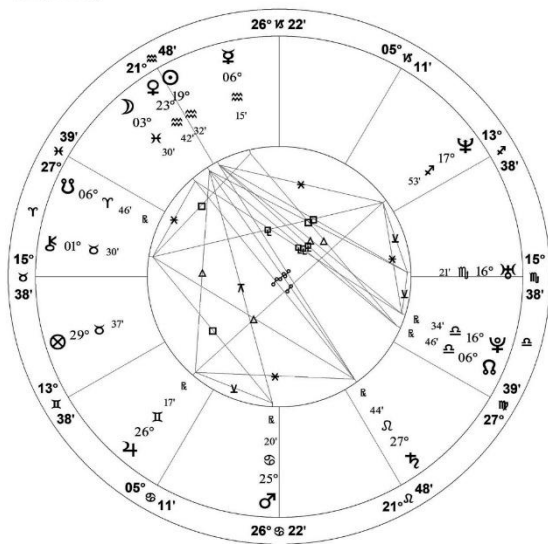


Western/Tropical Zodiac: Views the constellations and planets as they were during the time of the astrologer Ptolemy (100AD-170AD). So, *astrologically* you may have Venus in Taurus. But, due to the precession of the equinoxes over thousands of years, your Venus, depending on what degree it was in at your birth, could instead be *astronomically in* Gemini, because today Gemini is *astronomically* where Taurus used to be.

Sidereal Zodiac: Views the constellations and planets as they are today and uses the same house systems, etc. Anyone can use the sidereal zodiac. But, when the Hindu or Vedic astrologers use it, they do not include Uranus, Neptune, or Pluto, and they interpret things somewhat differently than do Western astrologers.



Two Main Zodiac Systems



To create a birth chart (natal chart, horoscope), you must have the following birth information:

- Month, date, and year
- Time of birth
- Place of birth

For example, at left:
February 8, 1978
10:36 a.m.
New York City, NY, USA



Erecting a Natal Chart



The birth time is used to calculate the Ascendant or Rising Sign. The Ascendant degree changes about every four minutes. The Ascendant determines what houses the planets are in.

Without an exact birth time, astrology in general, and predictive astrology in particular, are not nearly as accurate. Some general information and interpretations may be correct, but the subtleties and events-oriented aspects will almost always be off or completely incorrect.

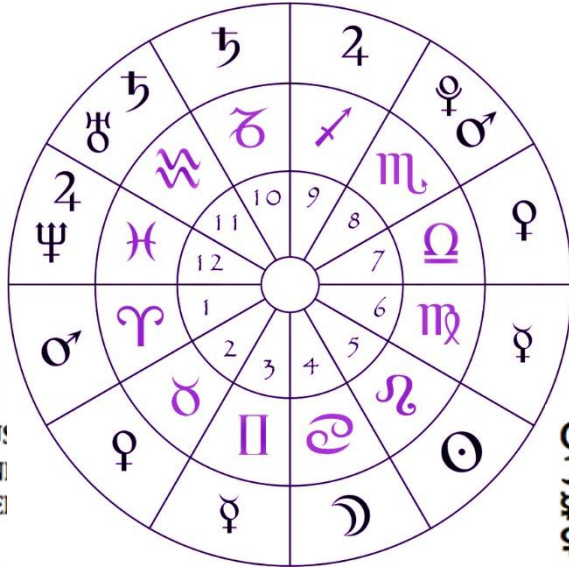

Times are not always stated on birth certificates. Or, sometimes the birth time is recorded as 9:02 p.m., but Mom swears it was 8:45, and Aunt Em says it was 9:15. There's a possible solution called rectification.

Rectification is time-consuming and expensive. It involves forecasting *backwards* in your life and adjusting your birth time until it coincides with all the various events in your life - if you can remember lots of dates and if you have a birth certificate to start the process.

The Natural or "Flat" Chart

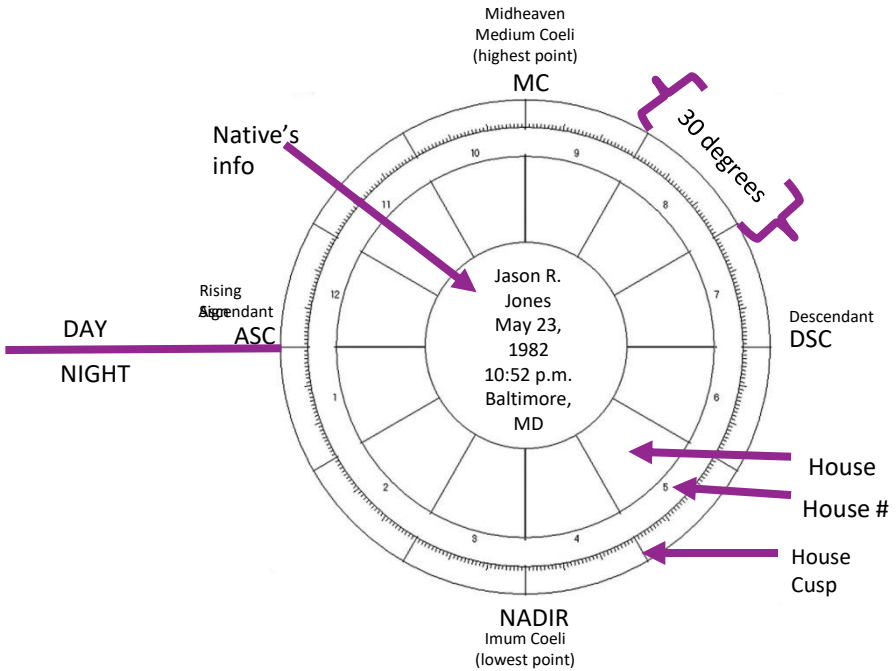
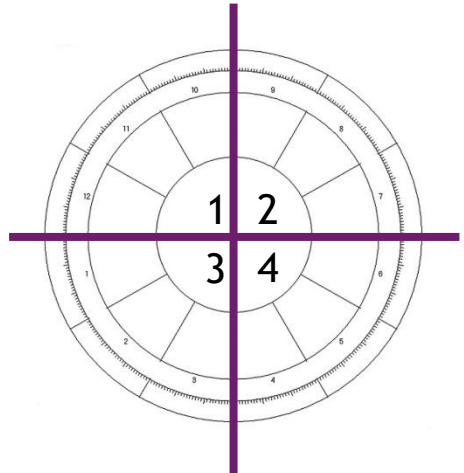


Chart Parts

Charts are divided into 12 houses. Charts are also divided into quadrants.



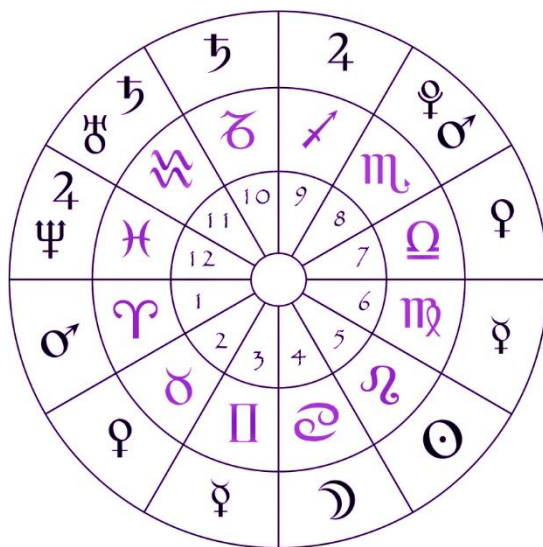
1. Houses 1, 2, and 3 represent your youth and development of self-awareness.
2. Houses 4, 5, and 6 represent your early adult years and the development of self-expression.
3. Houses 7, 8, and 9 represent your adult years and expansion.
4. Houses 10, 11, and 12 represent the period of maturity and development of self-actualization.



The quadrant with the most planets is your most important.



Chart Parts: Quadrants



Natal charts (a.k.a. birth charts, horoscopes) are divided into 12 numbered sections separated by lines called “cusps.”

How a natal chart's houses are determined depends on the house system used, which in turn determines the ASC and the placement of the planets in the houses.

Houses are the STAGES where the action and events of a person's life occur.

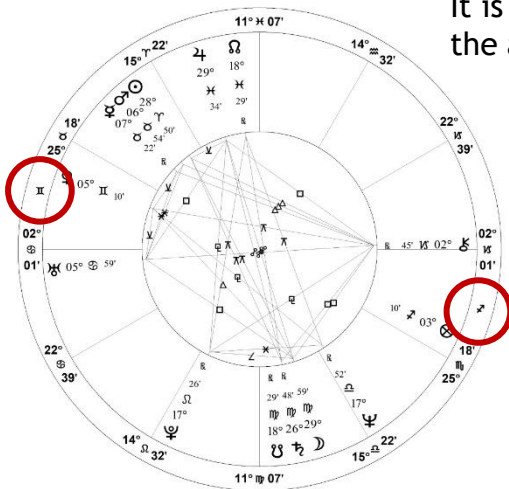

Placidus Houses

The Placidian system is an unequal house system named for Placidus de Titus (1603-1668) It was invented by Sephardic Jewish astrologer Abraham Ibn Ezra (1089-1167). It is used by at least 80% of the astrologers in the U.S.

Unequal house systems are most likely to have *intercepted signs*, meaning two signs are sharing a house with two other intercepted signs opposite them.



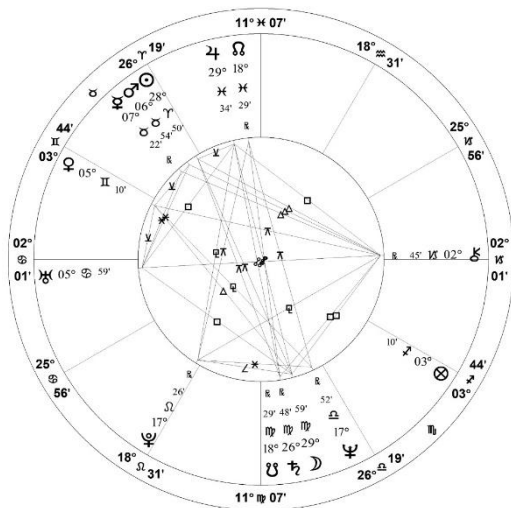

Koch Houses

The Koch system is the second most commonly used unequal house system in the U.S. It is named for German astrologer Dr. Walter Koch (1895-1970), but it was invented by Friedrich Zanzinger (1913-1967) and Heinz Specht (1925-?). Often used by people doing either Uranian or psychological astrology.

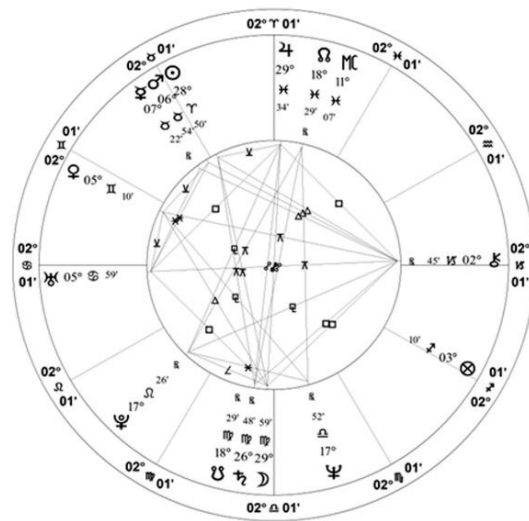


Koch House System



Equal house systems have been in use since ... well ... forever. But they are most popular in Europe. Because the houses are equal and start with the same degree on each cusp, they do not have interceptions.

Equal houses are especially popular with people who were born close to the poles, where interceptions of signs are most likely to occur.



Equal Houses

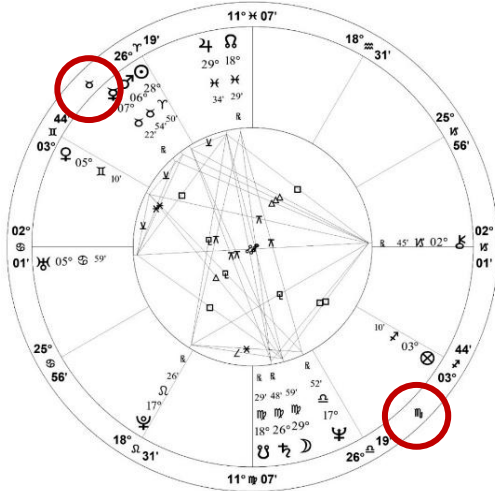


Intercepted signs are always found opposite each other in many unequal house systems.

Intercepted signs mean that two entire intercepted signs are enclosed within houses along with two other signs already in those houses.

Interceptions are usually interpreted as suppressed signs because they don't have their own houses. It's similar to renting an apartment rather than owning your own house.

The usual advice is to try to use the landlords' signs and planets to cope with whatever specific problems the tenants have.



Intercepted Signs



Every chart has a ruler, the planet that rules the sign on the Ascendant (your rising sign, the 1st house cusp). Your chart ruler is interpreted by the house it's in.

EXAMPLE: Your Ascendant (your rising sign) is Virgo, and Virgo's ruler (your chart ruler), Mercury, is in the 10th house. This makes you a good communicator (Mercury), particularly in the business environment or your chosen career (10th House). You are practical (Virgo), can speak to anyone or a room full of people (Mercury). You can write (Mercury) and sway people to your way of thinking. You are steady and stable (Virgo), with a good reputation (Virgo). You are organized and honest (Virgo).

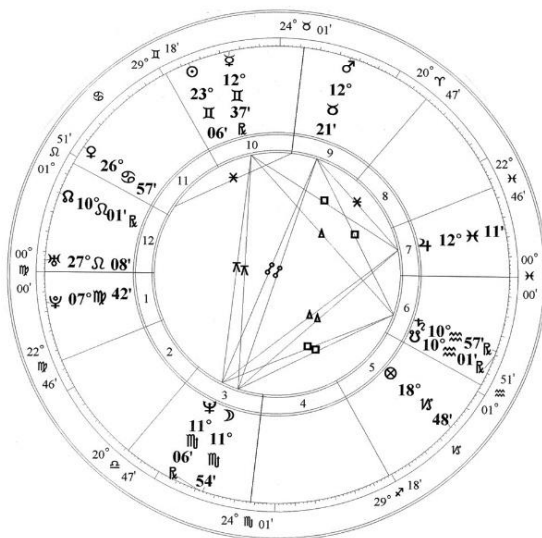

Major Aspects



Aspects are the relationships between and among the Sun, Moon, planets, signs, and other chart items that express how those bodies interact with or play their roles with others.



During forecasting, aspects are *applying* when they are about to form. They are *separating* when the aspect has reached its peak and is now ending.

Aspects are indicated by lines drawn from one body to another, usually with a glyph of the type of aspect on the line.



Major Aspects

There are other minor aspects besides these, including the nonile, septile, etc. But even the minor aspects in the table above are not used often and their meanings can almost always ascertained in the major aspects.

Regular chart wheels measure *longitude*, which results in a flat map (the zodiac) of the sky.

Declination measures *latitude* in relation to the celestial equator (the earth's equator projected onto the sky).

Two planets in declination are interpreted as a stronger influence.

|| PARALLEL. Occurs when two planets are in the same degree and sharing the same vertical space. It is a type of *conjunction*.

⏏ CONTRA-PARALLEL. Occurs when two planets are in the same degree, but one is above and the other is below the celestial equator. It is a type of *opposition*.

A very small orb (1-2 degrees) is used in determining declination.



Aspects: Parallels of Declination

Planets are “in orb” of each other when they are a certain number of degrees apart.

The “tighter” (smaller) the orb, the greater the influence the two planets will have on each other.

The greatest influence comes with an orb of 3 degrees or less. The “wider” the orb, the less the influence, or none at all.

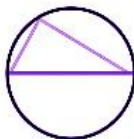

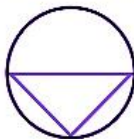

How aspect patterns (also called configurations) are interpreted is dependent on what houses and signs the planets in the pattern are in, and how they might also be in aspect with other planets.

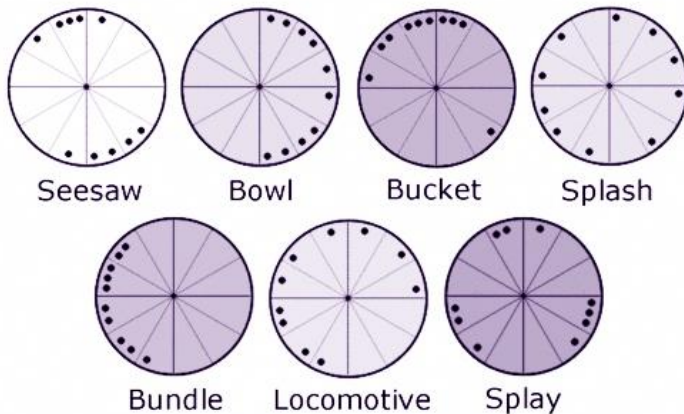
[NOTE: The Grand Cross is also called a Grand Square.]



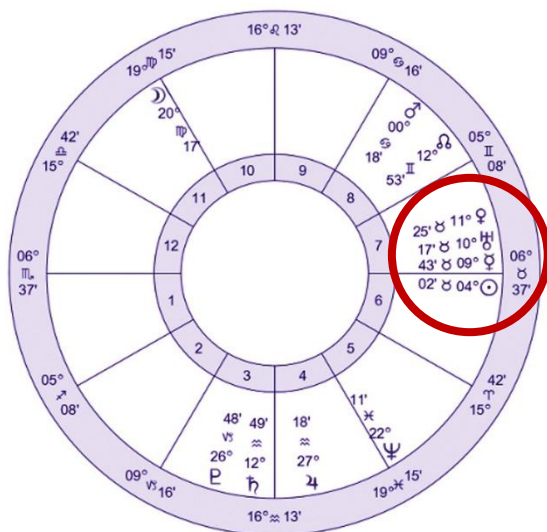
Aspect Patterns: 3 or More Planets



An aspect figure that resembles one of the ones below is interpreted by the individual aspects between its planets.



Aspect Figures



A stellium is an aspect pattern in which three or more planets are in the same sign.

The planets may span more than one house.

The stellium intensifies and strengthens its planets in the house(s).



Aspect: The Stellium



The lunar nodes are directly opposite each other in a chart.



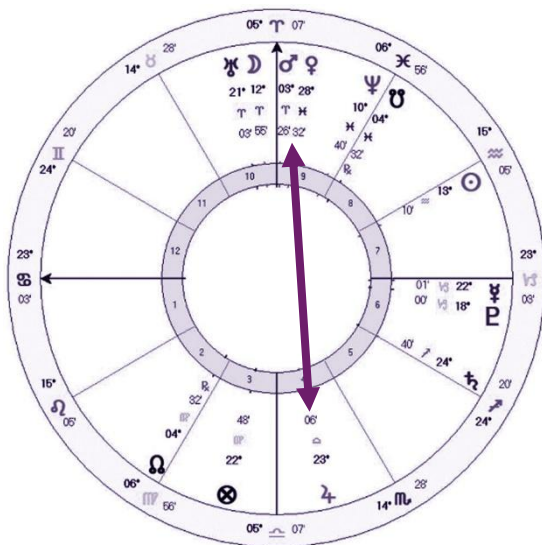
The North Node (a.k.a. “Rahu”) defines your destiny (what you may need to strive for if you’re stuck in the South Node). The North Node is the “karmic” adjustment (or correction) that your soul must make to advance as a soul, a spiritual being.



The South Node (a.k.a. “Ketu”) determines where and what you were in your past lives - your comfort zone because you’ve been there before. Your past lives have given you the tools you need to move forward in your current existence.



Lunar Nodes



Two planets are in mutual reception when they are in each other's signs.

An example would be Venus in Pisces and Jupiter in Libra.

If the condition of each planet in mutual reception is strong (i.e., they aren't badly aspected), they can strengthen and help each other.

A **CHART** is the **SCRIPT** of your life.

A **HOUSE** is the **STAGE** where things happen in your life.

A **PLANET** is an **ACTOR** who performs on the **STAGE**.

A **SIGN** is the **ROLE** that the **ACTOR** plays.

An **ASPECT** is how the **ACTOR** plays the **ROLE**.



Shortcut to Chart Interpretation



The benefic and malefic planets are not used that often in modern Western astrology. But, they do prove their abilities on occasion.

Benefic planets have positive influences and malefic ones represent problems and difficulties to be overcome.



BENEFIC PLANETS

Venus: supports your relations and interactions.

Jupiter: supports your good habits and practices.



MALEFIC PLANETS

Mars: brings tension and a downside to positive things in your life.

Saturn: is a reminder of how heavy the baggage is that you carry throughout your life.



Planets: Benefics and Malifics



- All astrological charts are maps of your potential.
- The choices you make determine who you are and what your future holds.
- Every chart is filled with hundreds of things to examine and interpret.
- It takes years of practice to become proficient in astrology. Learn your own chart 100% first.
- Knowledge of human behavior is critical in interpretation of a chart - even your own.



Delineation and Interpretation



- There are no “good” or “bad” planets or aspects.
- Every aspect and every planet has the potential to be good/positive or bad/negative and everything in between.
- How you effectively use or do not use the polarities determines the directions your life takes.
- Learn the polarities and use them to improve your life and overcome your own worst impulses.

TRANSITS - The events-oriented daily movements of the planets.

PROGRESSIONS - How you have evolved as a person:

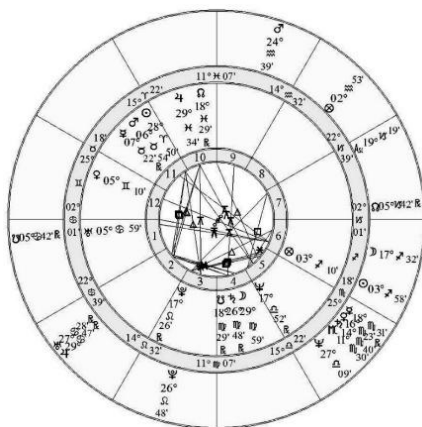
- solar arc/degree-for-a-year
- secondary progressions/day-for-a-year
- minor progressions/one lunar month after birth is one year of life
- tertiary progressions/one day is one lunar month of life
- converse progressions/one day pre-birth is one year of life

RETURNS - Erected for the exact date/time a planet returns to your birth date/time:

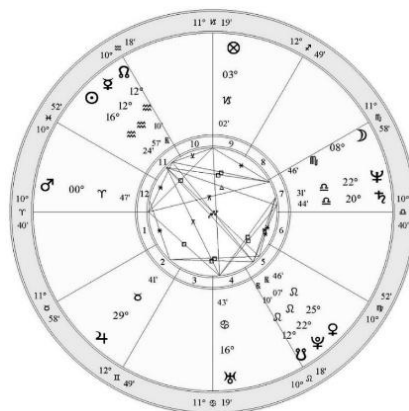
- solar returns/birthday charts

Synastry - Relationships



You can interpret all kinds of relationships - friends, spouses, employers, children, etc.

A great relationship is not necessarily filled with trines and sextiles.

A great relationship does not necessarily have strong chart-to-chart aspects of the inner planets (Sun, Moon, Mercury, Venus, and Mars). It may not have any.

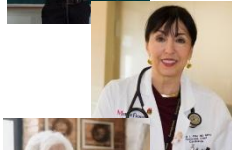
Some “negative” aspects may be favorable because they challenge two people to be better individuals (but it can also work in the reverse).



Midheaven Astrology-Relationships



The Midheaven (MC) represents the highest thing to which you can aspire in this life - your life purpose, the reason you exist.



The MC also reveals, in part, your best career or vocation choices.



The Sun, Moon, and planets, their houses and aspects help define what types of careers would suit you best.



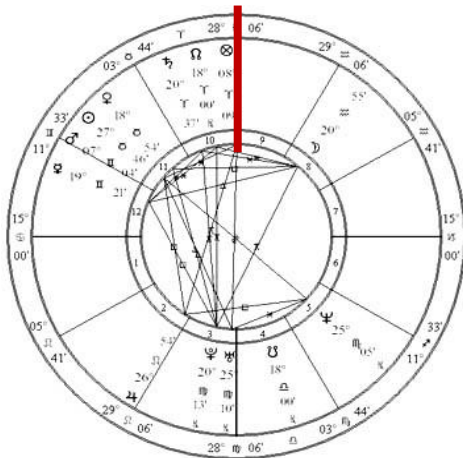
When your MC is followed, your entire life and everything in it improves.



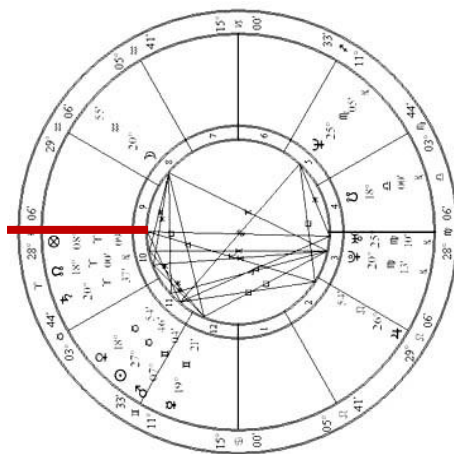
Midheaven or Vocational Astrology



Turn/rotate the chart until the house you want to examine more closely becomes the ASC. Interpret the derived chart the way you would a birth chart.



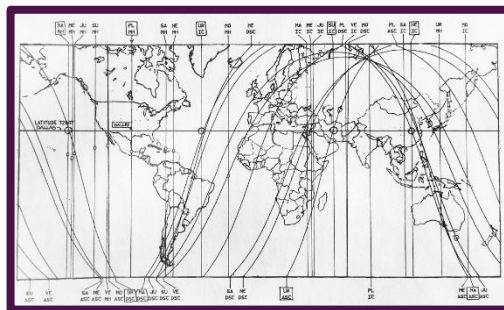
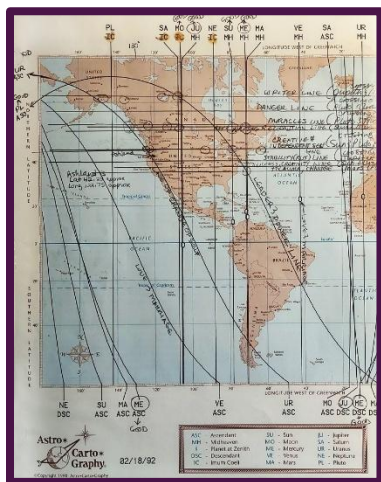

Chart Derivation-Turning the Chart



Astro*Cartography maps are hard to interpret. Cities and Towns reports are much easier to use, and you can pick up to 20 cities that interest you for an interpretation of each.



Relocation - Astro*Cartography



This is helpful if you are looking for the best places in the world for you to live well and affordably, work at your best job, find love and marry, have successful relationships, and be healthy and at peace.

When you relocate, there will always be trade-offs because some things will be improved and some things will be the same - or worse - than where you were previously.

If you relocate your chart, remember that you must also adjust your birth time (10:24 a.m., Portland, OR) to the time it was in the time zone you want to move to (4:24 p.m., Providence, RI).

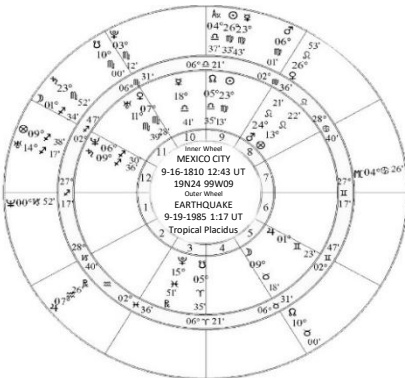


Relocation - Astro*Cartography



World events can be anything, including wars, disasters, earthquakes, elections, assassinations, epidemics, etc.

World events affect many people, and some events can't be pinned to a particular time or place.



For example, an earth-quake can have an epicenter, but the damage could be miles away too. Most mundane predictions are actually made after the event in order to “prove” it could have been predicted or to examine it historically.



Mundane Astrology-World Events



ELECTIONAL. If you want to find the best time to do something such as a wedding or the start-up of a business.

HORARY. If you have a specific question such as, “will I go to Paris next year?” or “will the police find my stolen car?”

ASTEROIDS & FIXED STARS. Interesting, but ...

ARABIC PARTS. Includes the Part of Fortune. This is a very ancient practice that was originally designed for use in investments in the futures market.

DECANS or DECANATES. An old practice occasionally used in the 20th century.

R **RETROGRADATION.** Retrograde means the planet is moving backwards. Planets do not move backwards. Period.



Questionable Practices?



Reports can be an easy and inexpensive introduction to astrology. They provide a simple delineation of your chart. But, they do have some limitations:

- they do not interpret aspect patterns, house rulers, mutual reception, and many other important chart items.
- they do not pull everything together and give you an overall picture of your personality, your relationships, your career, etc., the way an astrologer can.

You will probably need to consult with an astrologer to fill in all the missing data only an astrologer can provide.



Astrology Reports

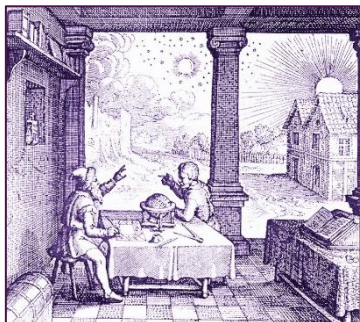


Professional astrologers examine and interpret a person's horoscope (natal or birth chart) as a whole. Everything in an astrology chart is part of a greater whole, everything works together.

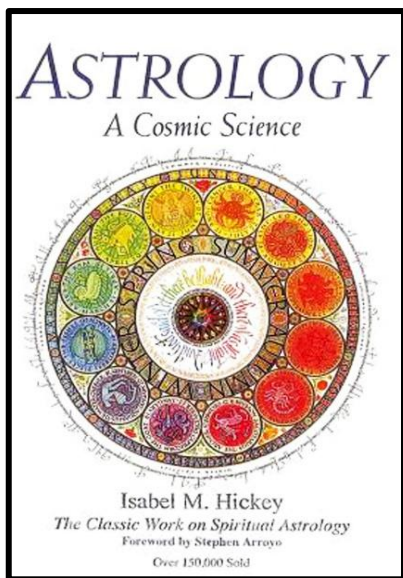
What a Good Astrologer Does



- All astrologers are different in personality and specialties.
- Your first consultation is usually about 1-2 hours (at least 30 min to an hour of that time is chart review before the consultation).
- Consultations can be done by email, phone, Zoom, or in person.
- Always have a list of questions you want answered or issues you want to have addressed.



Astrological Consultations
